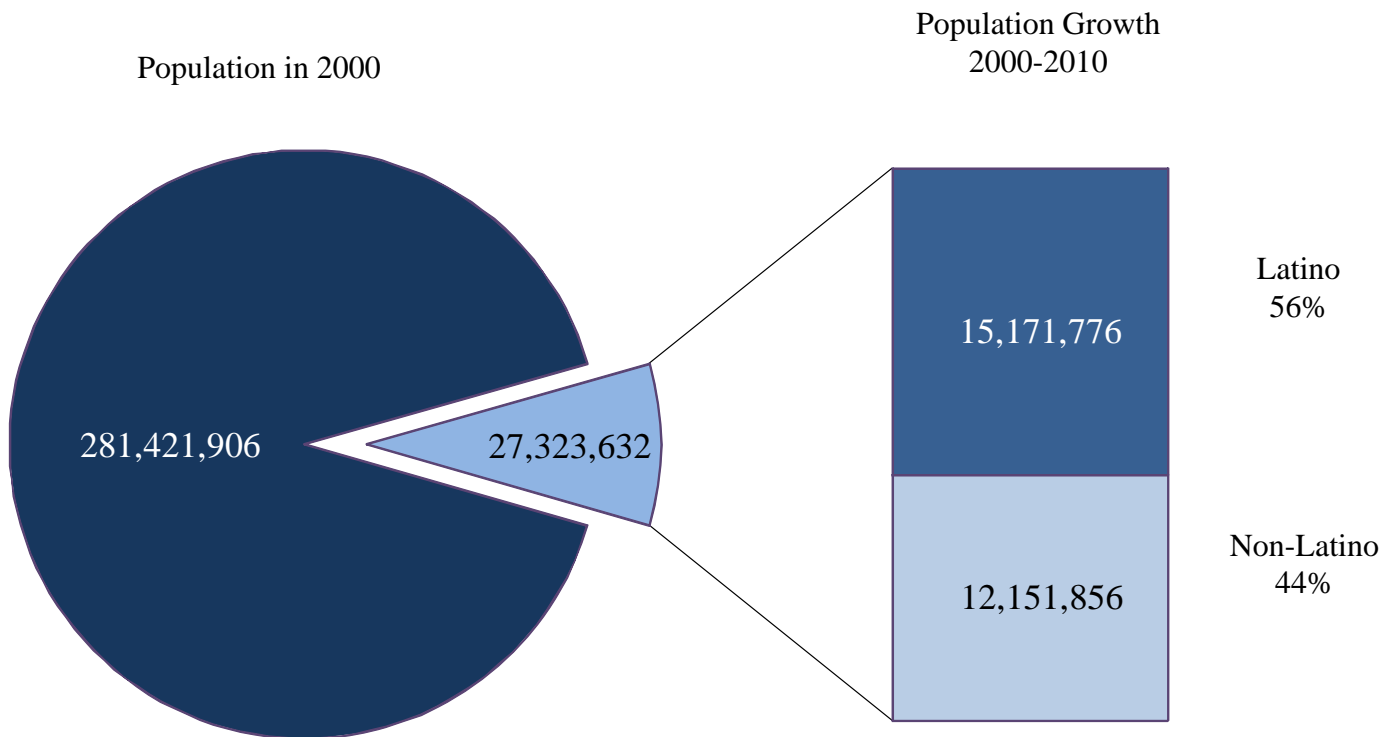

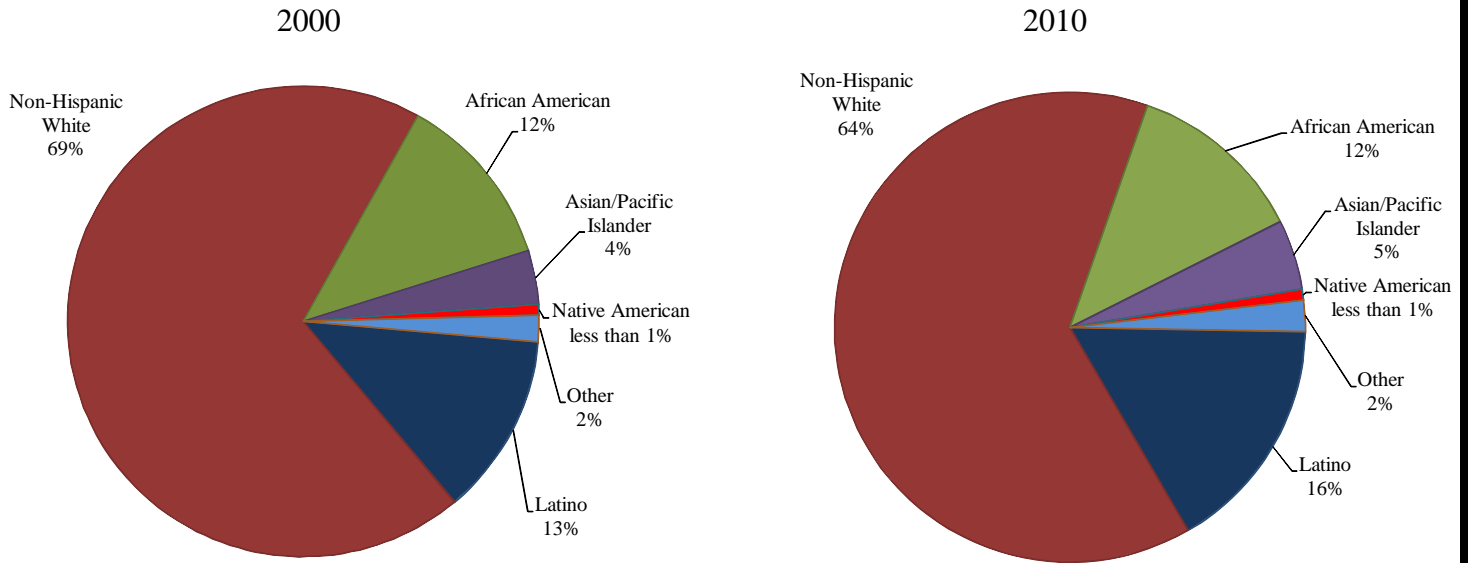
POPULATION GROWTH BETWEEN 2000 AND 2010

Between 2000 and 2010, the nation's population grew from 281.4 million to 308.7 million, an increase of 10%. During the same period, the Latino population grew from 35.3 million to 50.5 million, an increase of 43%.

The increase in the U.S. Latino population contributed significantly to the nation's overall growth during the last decade. Between 2000 and 2010, the Latino population increase accounted for over half (56%) of the nation's total population growth.



ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF POPULATION



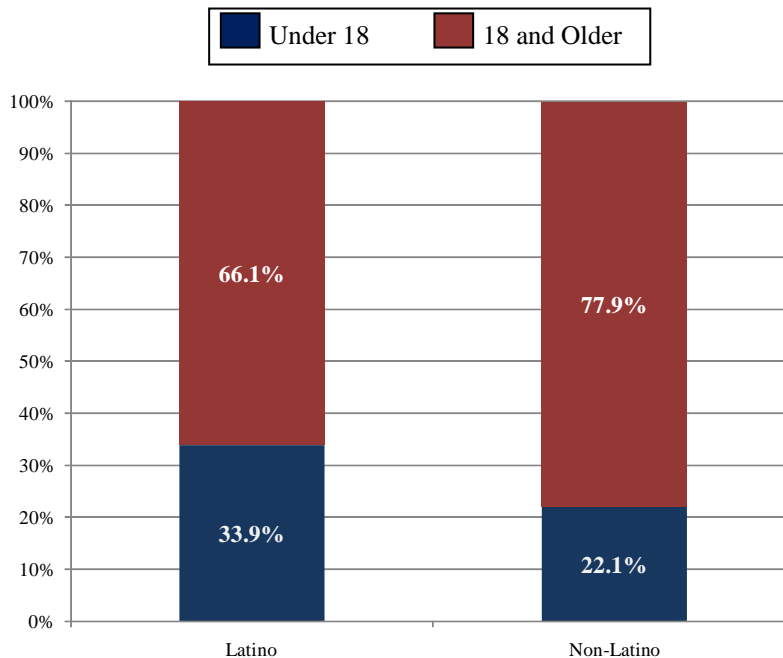
Between 2000 and 2010, the Latino share of the population grew from 13% to 16%, and one out of six of the nation’s residents is Latino. In 2000, 69% of U.S. residents were Non-Hispanic White; in 2010, Non-Hispanic Whites were 64% of the nation’s population.

AGE OF POPULATION: 2010

In 2010, 17.1 million Latinos were under 18, and 33.3 million were 18 and older. Latinos comprise 23% of all U.S. residents under 18.

In 2010, the nation’s Latino population was significantly younger than its non-Latino population. Over one-third (34%) of Latinos were under 18, compared to 22% of non-Latinos.



STATE POPULATIONS 2010

Census 2010 data reveal that 26 states have Latino populations of at least 300,000. The states with the largest Latino populations tend to be the traditional centers of Latino concentration in the United States, such as the Southwest, Northeast, Florida and Illinois. The top nine states with the largest Latino populations are home to three-fourths (76%) of the nation's Latinos.

There are significant emerging Latino populations in several areas of the country, including the Deep South, where Georgia and North Carolina both have more than 800,000 Latinos. Nevada is now home to 716,501 Latinos, and Massachusetts is home to 627,654. Other regions with sizeable Latino populations include the Pacific Northwest (Washington and Oregon); the Washington, DC metropolitan area (Maryland and Virginia) and the Midwest (Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Wisconsin and Kansas).

COUNTY AND CITY POPULATIONS: 2010

Census 2010 data reveal that all of the nation's 10 largest counties have significant Latino populations. The Latino share of these counties' population ranges from 20% in Kings County (Borough of Brooklyn) to 65% in Miami-Dade County. Seven of the 10 largest U.S. counties are also home to the state's largest Latino communities: Los Angeles, County, Cook County, Harris County, Maricopa County, San Diego County, Orange County and Miami-Dade County. The nation's 10 largest counties are home to over one-fourth (28%) of its Latino population, with 9% residing in Los Angeles County.

The nation's 10 largest cities also have significant Latino populations. The Latino share of these cities' population ranges from 12% in Philadelphia to 63% in San Antonio. Additionally, nine of the nation's major cities are also home to the nation's largest Latino communities, including New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Houston, Phoenix, San Antonio, San Diego, Dallas and San Jose. The nation's 10 largest cities are home to 17% of its Latino population.
